

Prophecy: The location of Christ's birth


Where was the Lord Jesus born?

What verse in Matthew chapter 2 quotes Micah's words?_


There were two places in Israel called Bethlehem. Micah's prophecy even specifies which Bethlehem it would be!







Now there was one thing Willow did not like; he didn't like it when Ruth tried to get up on his back. Every time she tried, he kicked up his heels, and down she came. But Ruth's Daddy had a special way to hold the little donkey's nose so that he would behave properly, and Ruth enjoyed her donkey rides around the field.

One day a family friend, Eddie, came to visit.

"Come and see my donkey," said Ruth.

"Oh, he's lovely," said Eddie, "do you ride on his back?"

"I do," answered Ruth, "but you will need to hold his nose like this so that he won't throw me off." And Ruth showed him how to hold Willow's nose properly.

"OK," said Eddie, and away they went.

But Eddie didn't like the feel of the donkey's slimy, wet nose, so he didn't hold it tight at all. It just looked as if he was holding it properly.
