Story Time

Eight children were lined up along the low wall of a large sandpit.

“Oh, just look at all that lovely golden sand,” said Sally. “Come on, let’s jump in.”

“No,” answered John, “the lady in charge of this place said we were to stay out of it for a little while. She said we would be hurt if we get in.”

Sally shook her head impatiently. “Well that’s nonsense, how could we be hurt? It looks smooth and clean and ready for us to play in.” And in she jumped.

When some of the other children saw that Sally came to no harm, they followed her example, jumped in, and started to play.

After a minute or two there were strange sounds coming from the sandpit.

“Ouch!” “Ow, that hurt!” “Oh, what was that?” “My hand is sore!”

And the two smallest children were crying. What could possibly be wrong?

Well, that sandpit was in a huge garden in Dublin, and every year it was cleaned out and two lorry loads of sand were dumped in to keep the sandpit fresh and clean. But this year, the holly bush at the entrance to the garden had grown across the top of the gateway and as the lorry went through, hundreds of prickly holly leaves fell into the sand. When the sand was dumped into the sandpit, the holly leaves were all covered up and everything looked fine. The lady in charge knew the danger and warned the children. But they couldn’t see the danger, and some of them ignored the warning.

In the Bible, God warns us of something far more dangerous than the holly in the sand; He warns us of the punishment we deserve for our sin. He also provides us a way to escape the punishment, by trusting His Son who suffered the punishment we deserve. If we ignore God’s warning we will have to endure the punishment ourselves in Hell forever. This story reminds us not to be like the children, who ignored the warning of danger.
