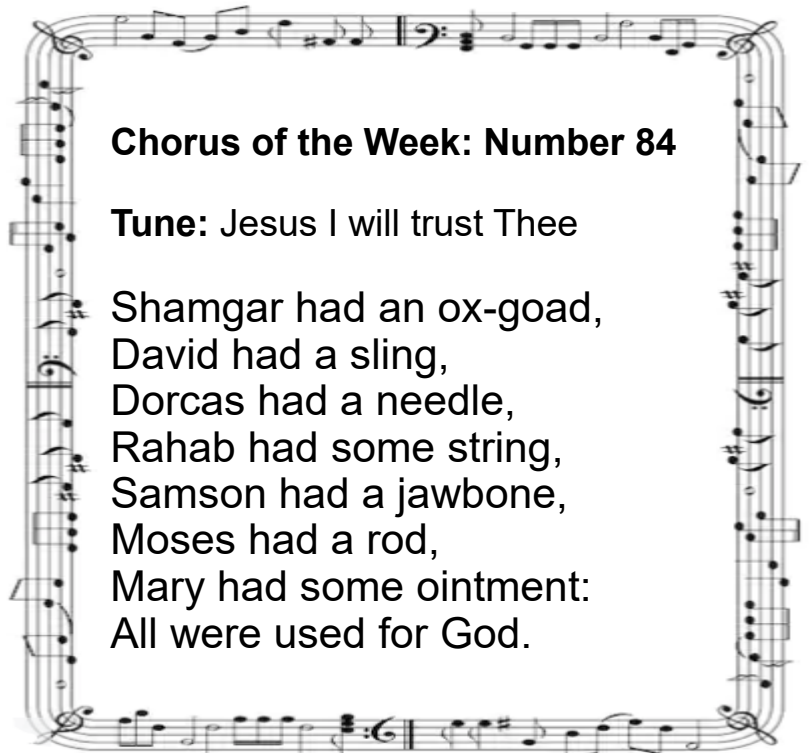
Hymn Writers
