They also said things that demonstrated their rejection.

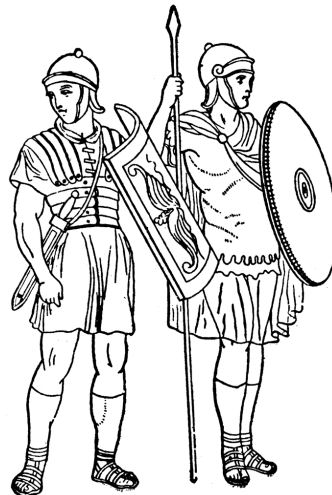

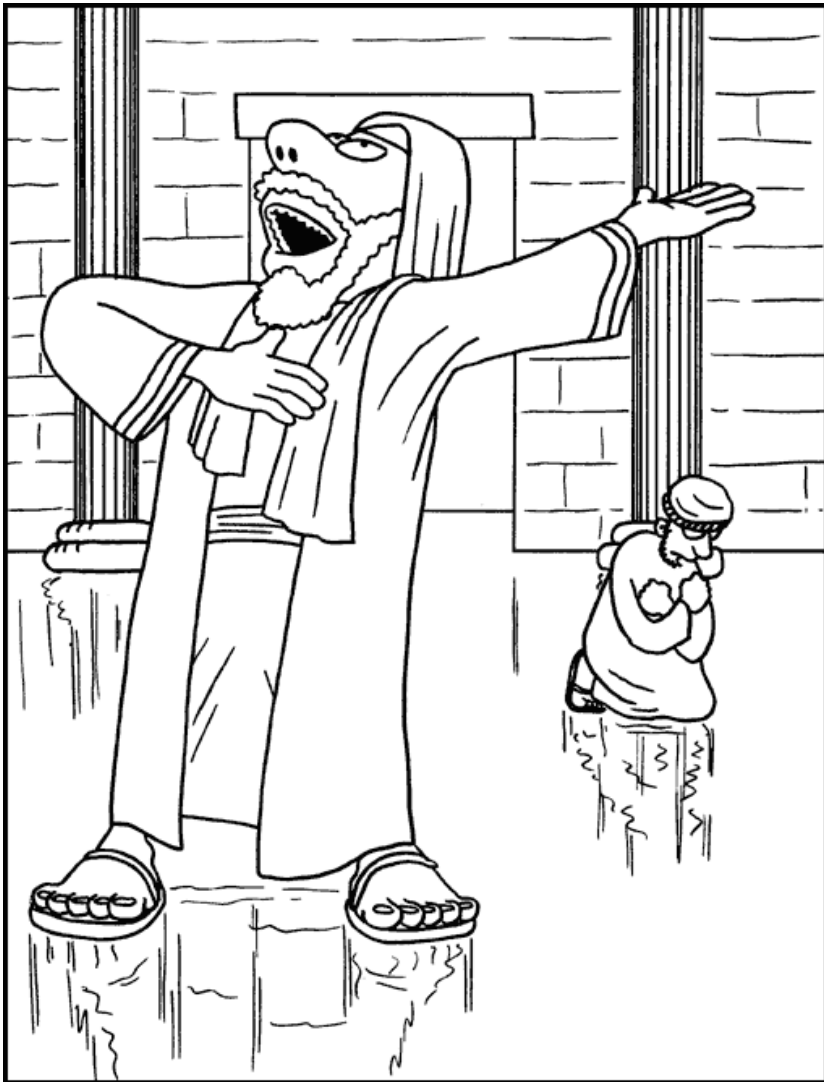

Bible Writer: James

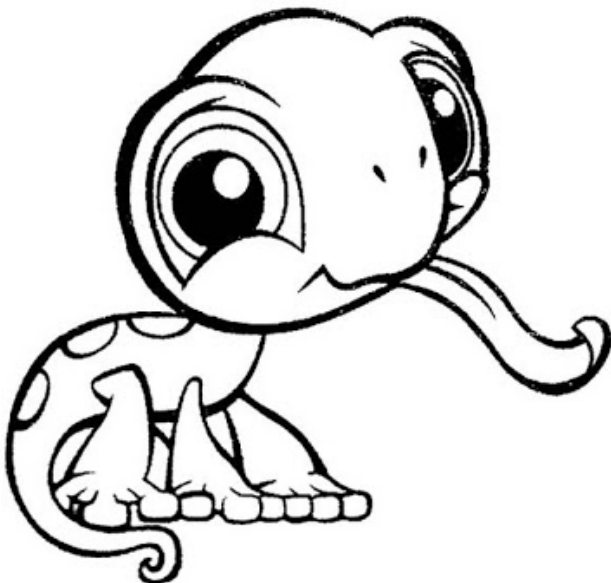
Which book did James write? _____

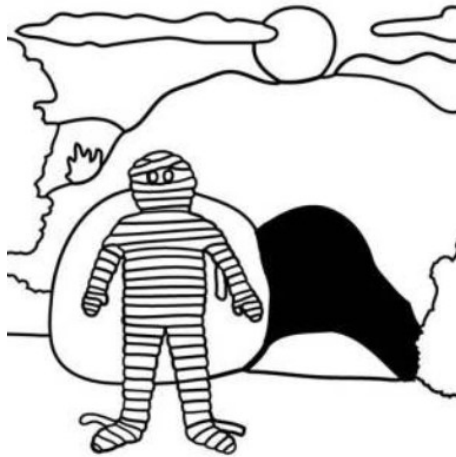

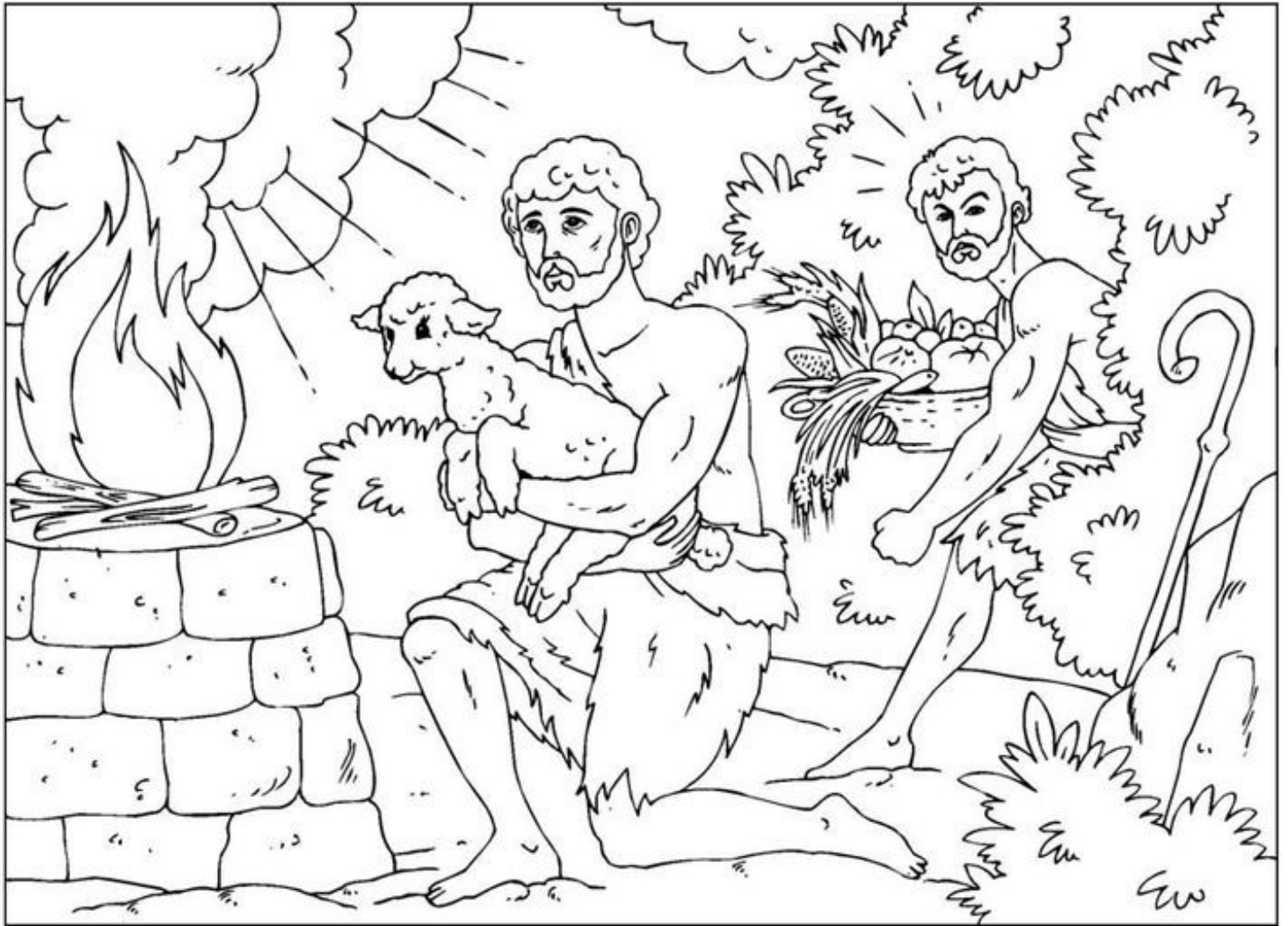

Read the story of Cain and Abel in Genesis chapter 4.



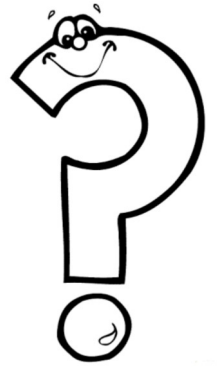
