Story Time

Dublin city centre is built around the River Liffey, and is bordered on the north side by the Royal Canal and on the south side by the Grand Canal. Years ago, big horses plodded along the towpaths pulling heavy barges full of cargo from Dublin city into the midlands of Ireland, and bringing other goods back to the city.



When the road links and transport improved, canals became quiet places and wildlife flourished.

Away back in 1970, it was decided that there would be a water sports gala held at Leeson Street Lock. It was a beautiful Saturday afternoon and crowds of people came to watch the fun. There were serious swimmers showing how fast they could swim, there were divers showing off their style and then there were fun swimmers, with blow up ducks and swans, racing around and giving the spectators plenty to enjoy.
