Story Time



“Come and help me!” shouted Clive to his big sister. Rosie knew by the sound of his voice that it must be urgent. She ran to him, and there he was, sitting with what looked like a pile of junk on his knee.

“Will you take this thing out of my eye please?” he asked.

It was then she noticed a small spring hanging from his left eye. She looked for a while and then very carefully turned the spring in the right direction to unwind it from his eyelid. It was good he had closed his eye so fast when the spring sprung, and his eye was not damaged, there was only a little mark on his eyelid.

“What are you doing?” Rosie asked, when all the drama was over.

“I just wanted to know about time,” he answered. “What is time? Where did it come from? Who gives it to us? How do we know what time it is? I asked Gran, but she

was busy, and didn’t have time to talk to me just now. So she gave me this old clock and said I could try and find some answers for myself. It was when I was taking it to pieces that the spring sprung into my eye”.

This happened way back in the early 1970s, and at that time most of the watches and clocks worked with springs in them. Every evening, or sometimes once a week, the clocks and watches had to be wound up again. Taking the clock to pieces certainly gave Clive a clue about how it worked, but it didn’t really answer his other questions.

The Bible has a lot to tell us about time. When God created the world He also created time. Here are three important verses that talk about time:

When the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth His Son.

Galatians 4:4

All people are sinners, and are separated from God. But God had a plan to bring people back to Himself. At the time He had always planned, He sent His Son into the world to become a man.

For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.

Romans 5:6

Even though the Lord Jesus became a man and lived among people, we still had no power to come to God. Our sins must be punished, so the Lord Jesus took that punishment and died so that we could be saved. This happened at the exact time God had appointed.

Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

1 Corinthians 6:2

Because the Lord Jesus has suffered the punishment for our sins, we can be saved if we accept Him as our Saviour. This is a decision you must make for yourself, and the only time God promises you is now. Nobody knows what will happen later today, or tomorrow. That is why the Bible says the right time to get saved is now.
