Story Time

Over the last three weeks we have been following the story of Molly, a young lady from Ireland who went to England for work and heard the gospel there. Last week we left her in England with her two younger brothers, and they too had accepted Christ as their Saviour.

But Molly was still thinking about her Mum and Dad, and her two older brothers back in Ireland. Her Mum had told her not to come back because she kept talking about the Bible and they didn't want to hear it. Molly was praying about her problem and was wondering how everybody was doing back home. In those days, very few people had phones in their houses, and nobody had a mobile phone. Can you just imagine that? You would have to write letters to your family and friends, and wait days for news.

One day Molly received a letter. "Dear

Molly" it began, "Please come home. Your Mum has become very sick and we would be very happy if you will come home and help us to care for her."

Molly was sad to hear her Mum wasn't well, and she immediately packed up and went home. She prayed for help to witness to the rest of her family and as she quietly and patiently helped her Mum, it wasn't long before the other family members started to ask questions about how to be saved. Molly told them the story in Acts 16 about the jailer who got saved, and all his household also believed, and how she asked God for that for her family. Her mother was in bed most of the days, and she had time to think and read her Bible, and she realised she was a sinner and needed the Saviour. What a change it made to the household when Molly's mum got saved, and then one of the older brothers. Her father accepted Christ too, and lastly, the oldest brother.

Molly went to heaven at the grand old age of 91, and her grandchildren and great-grandchildren are thankful for the dressmaker in England all those years ago who asked her to a gospel meeting.

If you are reading this, and you are already saved, keep praying for your family members, and if you're not saved, Molly's Saviour can be your Saviour too.
