Story Time

The house where Robert lived had a little yard behind it, but there was no space to run or play, and sometimes Robert had so much energy that he just jumped over the wall into some old abandoned gardens behind his house. It was like an adventure playground for him and his sister, with so much space, and trees to climb, and fruit trees coming into season. He discovered plum trees, and apple trees, and there were wild brambles with the juiciest blackberries in late August and September. One summer they made a tree house with a roof on it where they kept various treasures which they found in the garden. Robert loved nature and was always searching for spiders and beetles, to watch them in their habitats.



One hot summer day Robert's head appeared over the wall from the secret garden. "Mum!" he shouted excitedly, "I have made an amazing find."

He carefully climbed over the wall holding an old scruffy cup which he had picked up. "That's a dirty broken cup," said Mum. "Throw it away."

"The exciting thing is what's in the cup," answered Robert. "Just look inside."

When Robert's mum looked into the cup she saw an old dead mouse, covered in little creepy crawlies, and the smell was awful!

"Oh Robert," she exclaimed, "That might be the most exciting find for you, but it is full of germs, and touching it could make you very sick. You must go and bury it deep in the ground somewhere and then come straight back so that you can get washed and cleaned up."

Robert was very disappointed. He thought he could have kept his find and put it on display on a shelf in his bedroom. But his mum knew better, she made him scrub his hands, and she used disinfectant on everything he touched. The smell of Dettol lingered in the house for days as Robert tried to learn the lesson that some little things can cause us a lot of harm.

We all have to learn about a little word that describes something that causes us a lot of harm. That word is 'sin' and every person in the world has been infected by it. Robert thought the dead mouse was interesting and fun, but he didn't know it was dangerous. Many people think sin is fun, but they don't realise that sin separates us from God. Washing ourselves in disinfectant won't fix the problem of sin. There is only one thing that can wash away our sin. The Bible tells us what that is in 1 John ch 1 v 7:

The blood of Jesus Christ God's Son cleanseth us from all sin.

The disinfectant would have done no good to Robert if it was left in the bottle; it had to be applied. So by accepting the Lord Jesus as our Saviour, we can be saved and have our sins washed away.
